God is likely blessing you more than you think, but you may not be handling it well. In my conversations with long-term Christians who at times complain of financial tightness, most do not budget. That is a problem for them and for the Church. How are you supposed to be a good steward of what God has given if you do not account for it? The answer is you aren't. You may not wish to hear that, but it is the truth. Would any business be happy to have a manager that takes no account of the inflow and outflow of money? Why should God bless you more if you don't handle what He gives you well?

Too many Christians today wish to reward themselves and not be rich toward God. They ensure that their favorite trips, pastimes, and splurges are funded, but they do not even tithe to God. Why should God be happy with them and bless them? If your own child mismanaged the allowance, would you give them more? Why, then, do you expect the Lord to shower down material blessings upon you?

Most people look at Christian stewardship of money wrongly. They reluctantly give the gift, but they do not change their behavior to ensure better use of the money left over. As a person matures in faith, they realize that their habits are squandering both the gift and the remainder. Through more discipline and accountability comes a higher level of contentment, which in turn leads to a better offering, less unfunded long-term expenses, and the ability to save and invest. Over time this is a powerful combination of attitude and behavior that both gives sacrificially to God and grows wealth. Even in the Church globally most do not follow that pattern, as the temptation of riches and poor self-discipline due to sin prevail. But for those who in prayer and empowerment by the Spirit of God manage the income God has provided, they see for themselves that God is good and often gives more than we need.

### **WHEN THEY DON'T HAVE A REAL ANSWER**

It is called an ad hominem (meaning "to the person") attack, and it means a slight that has little to do with the argument. A famous example comes from a foremost Evolutionist, Richard Dawkins, "It is absolutely safe to say that if you meet somebody who claims not to believe in evolution, that person is ignorant, stupid or insane (or wicked, but I'd rather not consider that)."

Calling intellectual opponents stupid or insane is a bully tactic. It is popular among arrogant intellectuals who wish to insult people they oppose. They feel entitled to do so because they are convinced they are right. They think that it will sway some people to agree with them if they see how convinced and correct they are.

One of the hostile replies to Harrison Butker's commencement speech at Benedictine College came from a liberal woman who said that he can, "go F--- himself!" When people are filled with hate and disrespect, they give themselves permission to verbally assault those they hate.

Expect such responses to arise when you have intellectually cornered an opponent. Rather than acknowledging that the other person has a legitimate point, or providing a salient rebuttal, an emotional flare causes verbal hatred to erupt. When someone does that to you, don't worry much about it. It means you are winning the argument and they are frustrated.

### **MARTYRDOM**

The world witnessed what was done to the residents of Bucha, Ukraine in a war that has sadly lasted far too long. Some were tortured and then killed. It raises the question, could you do it? Could you remain steadfast in the face of torture and death? Christians are called by Christ to be faithful to death. The word martyr is the English transliteration of the Greek word for witness. Refusing to deny, even upon pain of death - that is the ultimate witness to Christ. Do you intend on developing your spirit such that literally nothing would turn you away from Christ?
