Evacuation orders had been given to Californians who elected to stay, perhaps to ward off looters. They chose to wait until the last second, until they saw the fire coming and the expected take place, their house burned up in flames. But they are praying, "God, save us..." There are few things more ingenuine than defying the order to evacuate, defying the commonsense God gave you to leave the material things behind, then praying, "save us". These people put themselves into the danger moment, risked their lives, then prayed to God to deliver them. That's stupid, and it's stupid faith.

This time, turning toward her friend, she reinforced, "Oh, how cute!" I said nothing else.

As I rolled the incident around in my mind, I think I know why she reacted as she did. I believe she was considering me to be like a baby or a little dog that when one sees them, they say, "How cute!" She evidently thought that the old man who uttered blessings was cute, a curiosity. She seemed unable to process the intent of the greeting. I wonder if she has so little spiritual background that the novelty of a Christian blessing is a rarity, and coming from an older man it's a cause for surprise.

I am hopeful that next time I can greet them with a blessing, I can explain a bit more and give a more direct witness for Christ. Maybe with time, she will find Jesus to be adorable!
